



3. STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

3.2 Stakeholder Engagement Process

APA has a well-established approach to stakeholder engagement and communications throughout a project. APA's approach to stakeholder engagement is guided by the following objectives:

- **No surprises:** Inform and engage community members and key stakeholders early in the process, and ensure they remain fully informed.
- **Be inclusive:** Ensure the community has easy access to clear and concise information about projects, ensuring all communications use language (e.g. non-technical) appropriate for each audience.
- **Be honest and act with integrity:** Always use facts and speak the truth. If the answer is not known then the question will be taken on notice, the appropriate parties spoken with and a response provided promptly.
- **Be responsive:** Respond to all stakeholder contact in a timely manner and make every effort to resolve issues to the satisfaction of all involved.
- **Be a part of the community:** Use projects to contribute to stronger local communities and provide economic and social benefit.

A Stakeholder Engagement Plan has been developed for the Proposal and forms the basis of the stakeholder engagement program. The overarching objective of the Stakeholder Engagement Plan is to provide a communications framework to support the delivery of a successful consultation and engagement program. This objective will be achieved through developing a strong rapport between APA, landholders and communities in the vicinity of the Proposal, and establishing local understanding and support for the Proposal. The Stakeholder Engagement Plan provides the overarching framework that identifies key stakeholders and outlines the strategy for engagement throughout the various phases of the Proposal.



3.3 Stakeholder Consultation

APA has commenced early engagement with all stakeholders identified in **Section 3.1**, to inform them of the Proposal, forward project phases and the activities proposed. APA will continue to consult with relevant stakeholders throughout the environmental assessment process. A summary of the engagement that has occurred to date is provided in **Table 3-2**.

APA maintains a live document of all stakeholders and any consultation to date. A summary of consultation will also be provided in the project-specific CEP, as submitted to DMIRS.

Feedback from all interested parties will be encouraged and monitored. An email (NGIproject@apa.com.au) has been set up for the Proposal and all material relating to the Proposal will reference this as the contact for feedback, complaints and queries.

Any third-party complaints will be addressed promptly, in accordance with APA Corporate procedures and the Stakeholder Engagement Plan. A complaints register will be maintained for the Proposal. All complaints will be addressed, and corrective actions tracked to completion for any substantial complaints.

Crossings will be removed during final reinstatement. On further discussion, the Darlot Group suggested that some work may occur. However, it would need to be accessed, well in advance, by the heritage monitors and construction representative so that the monitors can go back to the Darlot Group before giving any approval. The Darlot Group wanted to understand what stops people from wandering off into the bush. It was explained that during the induction it is strongly stressed the importance to stay within the cleared construction area. No one, vehicle or machine is permitted to leave the CROW. Discussed the Cultural Awareness information session and that, for a crew that is breaking ground (e.g. the clear and grade crew), a more specific information session is to be held with them.
